We are pleased to announce that our Villas' condo association insurance policies have been replaced, effective August 31st, by Cincinnati Insurance Company. This is a national, highly respected (A.M. Best financial rating of A+Superior) casualty and property insurer. They are represented by Ansay & Associates, an insurance broker who will service our Villas account here in Appleton.

A huge thank you and measure of gratitude to the assigned Insurance Committee – John Lundquist, Gretchen Davis, Tom Okray and Lee Leininger – for putting in months of work, providing information and negotiating with insurance agencies and brokers to secure this coverage. John in particular drew upon his many years of insurance experience to ensure the Villas obtained the best available coverage package.

If you recall our July newsletter message and the past couple of board meetings, I've mentioned the significant insurance cost and availability issues impacting condo associations – especially those of our size. Across the nation, severe storms and high replacement costs have driven many insurance companies out of the marketplace.

As a result, the cost of our Villas insurance **premium will increase by \$115,000** over what we paid for the prior policy period. Contributing to this steep rise were the overall valuation of all our buildings and the tremendously difficult conditions in the market.

We will also see an increase in our property deductibles. The deductible for Wind & Hail damage will average \$36,000 for each fourplex; \$21,000 for each duplex. The deductible for all other insured perils will be \$10,000 per occurrence.

As also mentioned in the July newsletter, you are highly encouraged to **obtain at least \$10,000 of Loss Assessment coverage on your homeowner's policy**. In the event of damaging winds or hail, having such coverage would help offset deductible payments that may require a unit owners' assessment.

CONDO NEWS

The Insurance Committee evaluated alternative insurance proposals that involved a complex layering of surplus insurance lines, with premium and deductible costs far in excess of Cincinnati's proposal.

We recognize that this is a significant increase in our association insurance coverage. However, we are now covered through August of 2025 by a standard insurance carrier with an excellent reputation and local service support.

The Board will be taking the new insurance program and method to best handle the increased cost into our upcoming budget discussions. Details will be shared at the October Annual meeting.

Please do not interrupt Lowney's crew to instruct them on how to do their job.


Workers on our property are using loud machinery and sharp cutting tools. SAFETY is paramount!

Well here we go again...this is the "SECOND CALL" for candidates to run for election to the Villas' HOA Board of Directors.

The Board consists of six members. Each year two members will be elected to serve a three-year term to replace those whose terms are expiring.

The election will take place during our fall general meeting scheduled for October.

The two members whose terms are expiring are Gary Krueger and Keith Uhlenbrauck.

Open meetings are held monthly. The Board's primary duty is to be good stewards of the community's finances, which includes budget preparation and expenditure authorization. Further duties are responsibility for possible changes to our Rules and Regulations, review of homeowner change requests, complaint and problem solving, and oversight of our various committees.

General qualifications:

- 1.) Full-time residents are preferred to make meetings easier, but with various electronic means of communication available, "snow birds" can become candidates.
- 2.) Incumbent members are eligible to run for successive terms.
- 3.) Each homeowner unit will vote for up to two candidates. Over-voting will void that ballot.
- 4.) As in the past, proxies can be assigned. There are no provisions for absentee ballots.
- 5.) Additional nominations can be made at the meeting and ballots will be provided for that and/or write-ins.

This is your opportunity to join the board and make a difference.

The next step is to write a one hundred word (approx.) bio of yourself, describing why you have interest in becoming a Board member and your pertinent capabilities. Send the bio to Gary Krueger by September 27, 2024. This is to provide adequate time for ballot preparation and the October newsletter posting.








-SCAM ALLERT-

It is a warning about a phishng approach that we have not seen before.



Look closely at the letter "a" in the address. It is different. The "a" in the later address is from a cyrillic alphabet and will take you to a scammers website and they would be more than happy to steal your idenity.

-Plastic Card Scam-

This scam is aimed directly at the us, the older population.

Don't divulge any of your ID numbers when a stranger calls!

If you get a call asking you if you have received your plastic social security card or plastic medicare card, just HANG UP! It's a scam to get your social security or medicare number and other information to steal your ID.

Instead of clicking on a link or giving out information on a phone call that you did not initiate, contact the bank or campany from your contact information and ask if they actually sent you a link or called you for some reason.
